

Tawni O'Dell's address will be followed by an interview with Jean Feraca, long-time host of Wisconsin Public Radio's "Here On Earth."



Tawni O'Dell is the New York Times best-selling author of the novels "Fragile Beasts," "Sister Mine," "Coal Run" and "Back Roads," which was an Oprah's Book Club pick.

"Back Roads" is currently in development to be made into a film by Michael Ohoven, the producer of the Academy-Award-winning "Capote." O'Dell adapted the screenplay, which is set to be directed by Adrian Lyne.

O'Dell was born and raised in the coal-mining region of western Pennsylvania, the territory she writes about with such striking authenticity. She graduated from Northwestern University with a degree in journalism and spent many years living in Chicago before moving back to Pennsylvania where she now resides with her two children.

When people hear the phrase "intellectual freedom," very likely thoughts turn to other parts of the world that do not share the United States' commitment to the open exchange of ideas, a cornerstone in our democratic principles. And while it is true that authors like Salman Rushdie did have to worry about death threats when his controversial The Satanic Verses was published in 1988 and today, we see Google and China in an ongoing battle over censorship, there are still problems with free and wide access to information closer to home.

Banned and challenged books constitute one area of focus for librarians and educators who recognize that our citizens need exposure to a wide range of ideas unmediated by certain people's taste or sense of propriety. Less attention, though, is being paid to those in our communities who are not able to readily access books, which have the power to transform lives. Those who are incarcerated, for example, may need the knowledge and wisdom of great minds more than anyone but too often prisons' libraries are scarce and badly neglected. Similarly, nearly half the children in the United States are not read to by their parents despite compelling evidence that growing up in a print-rich environment forges a life-long passion for literacy.

We as a society must do what we can to make sure that the world of ideas reaches to the far corners of this vast land and especially our most vulnerable populations. It is in all of our best interest to make our nation a place where freedom "reigns," in principles and practice. Toni Morrison, who will be awarded the Presidential Medal of Freedom this year, wrote famously, "Access to knowledge is the superb, the supreme act of a truly great civilization."

Ellyn Lem, associate professor of English at the University of Wisconsin-Waukesha, has been awarded the 2012 Lee Burress Intellectual Freedom Award by the Wisconsin Council of Teachers of English. The award, named in honor of the late Lee Burress, an English professor at UW-Stevens Point, is granted to an educator, librarian, volunteer, administrator, group or organization in recognition of a particular action or a long-term interest in and dedication to the cause of intellectual freedom.


